PASTOR'S PEN

Together We Are Steppig Out In Faith

On Sunday, December 17 the congregation met and voted to give authority to proceed with the development of a one site plan on McKay and to actively pursue the sale of the Douglas Street property. The vote was 180 yes and 2 no. It was the first time a congregational meeting at First Lutheran was live streamed on Facebook and made available to our snowbirds and those unable to attend in person. 17 members voted via Facebook

Over 12 years ago we began to look at the challenges and opportunities ahead of us, it became increasingly apparent that our present facility was not adequate to move us forward into the future. More recently, over the last months we became convinced that operating out of two sites was an unwise investment of our resources and an inefficient use of space and staff. As a result, with congregational approval we will now pursue a one site approach.

We have come a long way and yet a number of steps remain. Over the next month we will continue to finalize the building design and work on a finance plan. We will also list our current location and pursue a buyer. After bids are received in February we will then have a final cost for construction and hold a congregational meeting in late February or early March. The Building Committee and Vision Team will bring a recommendation to the meeting of how to proceed.

Every day you and I take steps of faith, not knowing exactly what each new day holds. It was the same for Abraham and Sarah, for Noah, and for Paul. As we take this step of faith and build our new church home, there is no "easy button" to hit or someone else who will "make it happen". Throughout our 145 years, we as a congregation have made such steps countless times.

This particular step of faith gives us a plan forward that...

- enables us to be at one site
- gives us more room for worship and hospitality
- a fully accessible building on one level
- a more functional and flexible plan
- expands our ability to be more available to the community
- increases energy efficiency
- allows us to continue to enhance and grow our mission

A lot of time, energy and investment has gone into making this plan a reality but this is about much more than just a building. It is about our vision and mission to our community and beyond. It is about what God is doing right now in our midst and it is about being a church that will continue to be relevant and touch lives for generations to come.

Thank you to the 324 households who have committed \$3,554,558 toward the "From the Ground Up" Capital Campaign. Thank you for taking that step of faith. It's never too late for anyone who has not yet done so to get on board. Info packets and pledge cards are available in the church office and Welcome Center.

2018 is going to be an exciting year at First Lutheran as we step out in faith together.

COMMUNITY PRESCHOOL

Community Preschool of First Lutheran Church was founded by Opal Martinson in 1960. It was then called Martinson Nursery School. Opal operated the first licensed nursery school in her home on 10th Avenue East in Alexandria. On May 20th, 1979 it was approved by the First Lutheran Church congregation and signed by Rev. Keith A Lentz to become part of First Lutheran Church. Mrs. Martinson donated her nursery school equipment and the name was changed to Community Nursery School.

Today the program is known as Community Preschool of First Lutheran Church. It is owned and operated by the church as an outreach and ministry with the purpose of "providing an early childhood social and educational experience in a Christian atmosphere."

Community Preschool is a state licensed preschool. We provide half-day classes for children 3-5 years of age. We also have a one day morning class for children that turn 3 years of age by January 1st. The program is based on Early Childhood Indicators of Progress (Minnesota's early learning standards), Minnesota Core Competencies and the Early

Childhood Environmental Rating Scale. Our emphasis is on the abilities and interests of each child. The preschool goals are to develop a love of learning, give children a sense of self-confidence in the classroom, provide many opportunities to express themselves and follow directions, and prepare them for their next step in the world of education. Our teachers are licensed educators. Through having the freedom to write their own curriculum, the teachers can prepare lessons with themes that interest the children. Many times this leads to the teachers writing new curriculum each year. The classroom schedule includes structured activity time with an emphasis on play. The classrooms are set up to stimulate mental, physical and social emotional development.

Currently the preschool employs two teachers (Melisa Schueler: Teacher/Director and Kelli Risnes:Teacher) and two assistant teachers (Helen Maier and Angie Carstesen).
