Led by David Cherwien and Susan Palo Cherwien, this hymn festival will be Sunday, November 12 at 4:00pm at First Lutheran.

Join us as we celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation with the Festival of Hymns titled, "To God I Give My Melody – Hymns of Martin Luther." All are welcome to attend this free event.

The Hymn Festival will be led by David Cherwien and Susan Palo Cherwien. David Cherwien is the Artistic Director of the National Lutheran Choir and a nationally known conductor, composer, and organist. He also serves as Cantor at Mount Olive Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, a parish known for its passion for traditional liturgy and creative, high-quality music.

Susan Palo Cherwien is a free-lance writer and musician. She has written the text for 8 hymns in the Evangelical Book of Worship. The event will also feature the combined choirs from First Lutheran, Calvary Lutheran, Shalom Lutheran, and Bethesda Lutheran churches. The program will consist of many of the hymns of Martin Luther, with reflections by Susan Palo Cherwien interspersed throughout.

Building Update

Over the last few months the Building Committee, staff and various committees and boards made up of members have met with our architect to define the functionality and design of the building plans.

On Monday, October 16 the Alexandria Planning Commission met and unanimously approved First Lutheran's Conditional Use application requesting to allow construction of the first phase of our new church home. On Monday, October 23 our approval plan was presented to the City Council who also gave us the green light by unanimous vote.

On October 23 the Building Committee interviewed three construction companies to work on our behalf. Two local companies and one regional company took part in the interview process. The next step is to bring a recommendation to the Vision Team and the congregation.
