Moving Forward Together

Dear Friends in Christ,

Many of us grew up understanding that there are a few topics that should be avoided, such as religion, politics, and......money. In fact 44% of Americans point to personal finance as the most challenging conversation of all. Nonetheless, over the last few weeks, we ventured into that challenging terrain through our sermon series entitled, Money and Meaning. While it may have caused some of us to be uncomfortable, we felt it was an important and healthy conversation to take place.

We also felt that way as we came to the last few months of 2017. We wanted to be able to end the year in good shape, but in order for us to do that we felt it was our responsibility to communicate our shortfall, and correct it. To that end it is our commitment to always be transparent and upfront with you.

The 2017 figures are completed we ended the year with a deficit of \$12,694. While this isn't where we wanted to land, this is just part of the story. We need to not only look at our shortfall, we need to also celebrate that together, we gave over \$1,077,178 in support of our day to day mission, and over \$1,148,036 to the building fund in 2017. First Lutheran is a generous and engaged congregation. We need to give thanks for lives that are being touched. God is doing some amazing things through this congregation. When you hit a bump or fall down, you get back up and figure out how you're going to find your way forward, and that is exactly what we are doing.

These are exciting days for First Lutheran. And as exciting as it is to think about building our new church home, let's remember why we exist and what our mission is. A building is just a tool. Our most important calling is to reflect the light and love of Jesus, to touch lives, and to bring hope. Our first commitment is to live out and support our mission, because if we don't do that, our building (old or new) won't matter. What makes First Lutheran unique is that we always find a way to come together and serve Christ.

For us as a congregation, our mission is something that we all have a stake in and always comes first. But that is possible only because each one of us steps up and invests ourselves, our time and our financial support in it. This is what makes First Lutheran the special place it is. Thank you for all that you do and the difference you make in the lives of so many.

I hope you will set aside the time to be a part of our Annual Meeting, Sunday, February 11, 2018. We will have lunch beginning at 11:30am with the meeting following at approximately 12:30pm. It is more than just a meeting, it is a celebration of what God is doing in and through us. I hope to see you there.

Parish Health

The New Year is a great time to write your Family Health History

A family health history can be key to your wellness as well as to that of your kids and grandkids. Think of it as a family tree all about your health! Here are some questions to ask each relative to create your family health tree: What chronic conditions do you have? Have you had any other serious illnesses, such as cancer? How old were you when you developed each illness? Have you had pregnancy or childbirth issues? What countries did our relatives come from? Has anyone in the family had birth defects, learning problems or developmental disabilities? What illnesses did our late grandparents have? How old were they when they died? What did they die of? Options for creating your own document include printed and online versions. Visit www.hhs.gov/familyhistory to locate the format that works for you (My Family Health Portrait Tool). Once you fill in the information, share it with your healthcare provider and with other family members, especially children and grandchildren, to help them live healthier lives too.
