New Building Update

It was an exciting night as the congregation came together on Wednesday, March 21 and said YES to proceeding with the construction of our new church home and authorizing First Lutheran to borrow \$4,150,000.00 from Mission Investment Fund of the ELCA. There was good discussion and many questions. It was felt that a realistic and thorough plan was presented.

There were 214 members present and the vote was 208 yes and 6 no. This is a bold step for FLC, but we take it trusting that just as God has been faithful in the past, we believe that God will continue to make a way. Neighborhood Gatherings


