Radio Broadcast Time Change

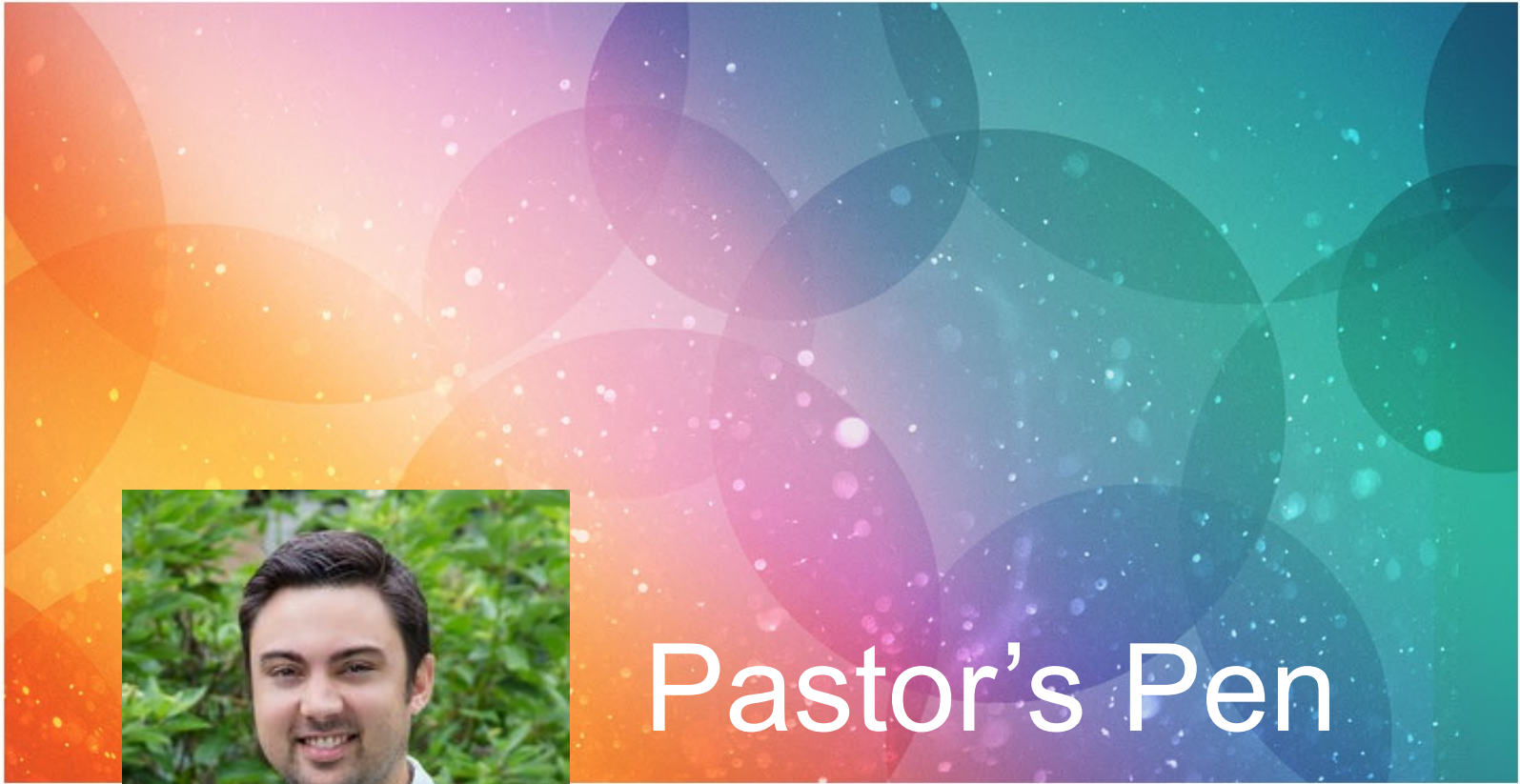
Thank you for your continued support of this important ministry!

An Exciting Summer Ahead

This is an historic summer for us as a congregation as we prepare to move from our location at 9th and Douglas to our new church home. Here is a brief timeline of when and what is happening:

First week of May	Our historic bell from 1907 was removed, sent to Ohio to be restored and fitted for its new home in our bell tower at the new building.
June	Garage build by volunteers from the congregation. Watch for more details.
July 15-19	Offices and items from current location will be moved to new facility.
July 22	Staff members begin working at their new offices at the new location. Worship and funerals will continue to happen at our current facility through August 4.
July 30	<u>2:00-3:00pm</u> : Coffee and refreshments at our new site for our seniors who are 75+ years old. This is an opportunity to check out parking and become familiar with our new location prior to our move.
August 4	<u>9:00am</u> : On Our Way Rejoicing! There will be ONE worship service at our current location and continuing with a procession to our new facility where we will celebrate communion. Afterward we will celebrate with a congregational church picnic.
August 5	Beginning Aug 5, all in-house worship and other congregational functions and ministry will happen at our new church home as of this date. The new mailing address is 1655 18th Ave W, Alexandria.
Mid-August	Organ Update: We are grateful to be able to have the organ with us through Sunday, Aug 4. After that, the organ will be carefully removed, packed and stored until it will be reinstalled in Phase 2 of our building project.

Congregational Vitality Survey

In March, we invited the congregation to fill out a survey to help us develop a better understanding of how members perceive the congregation’s connection with God, with one another and with the world around us. Over 230 members participated in the survey, with a good representation of our different age groups.

The survey revealed a healthy confidence in our mission as well as a positivity about the congregation and its ministries. It revealed as well that we have a hopeful sense of moving forward and good energy as we prepare to make our move to our new church home this summer. The survey revealed a good understanding of who we are, what our capacities are, and what we have to build on.

- The three areas that members identified as growth areas were:
- 1) The need to build a deeper level of engagement and involvement by the congregation
 - 2) An interest in growing in their faith
 - 3) A need for help in being able to talk about their faith

At a time when many congregations are looking back in

terms of their best days, the survey revealed that First Lutheran is excited for the future. There is a pride in how we relate to our community, and anticipation for even more possibilities of how to connect and build stronger relationships with our community at our new facility.

In April, leadership from the congregation held a retreat to assess the results from the survey and has another retreat scheduled in early June. Jim LaDoux, our congregational coach who we hired to assist us in this process this year, is helping us put a road map and process in place that will lead us forward over the next three years.

Thank you to all who took the time to complete the survey. Your input is vital and has helped us to identify both areas of strength as well as areas where we have to opportunity to grow. We will continue to make you aware of how this process is unfolding.

Journey of the FLC Bell

First installed in 1907 in the little white First Norwegian Lutheran Church, our bell has been tolling for 112 years on the corner of 9th and Douglas Street. Removed from the little white church in the early 1940’s, it was installed in our present bell tower in the late 1940’s when the current church and bell tower was built.

We are excited that our bell will be tolling at our new church home late this summer. In order for the move to be made possible, the bell was removed from its present location on April 30, 2019 and shipped to the Verdin Bell Company (one of the last bell foundry’s left in the US) in Cincinnati, OH for restoration, cleaning and fitting of the new steel pipe tube mounting bracket. Why the journey to Cincinnati? Each bell is slightly different when poured/cast and when the new hanging bracket and vibro isolator (eliminates vibration) is molded for our bell it must be present for proper fitting. If this bracket and isolator are not properly fitted, the ring of the bell will change and we would no longer toll a beautiful G flat.
